SPECIAL MEETING

January 5, 1982

MINUTES

The special meeting of the State Board of Technical Registration, held in Room 315. Occupational Licensing Building, 1645 W. Jefferson, Phoenix, Arizona was called to order by Chairman Charles E. O'Bannon at 8:45 am.

Those present constituted a quorum.

1. EXECUTIVE SESSION - Legal Advice

A motion to go into executive session was made by Mr. Riggs and seconded by Mr. Brown. At the end of executive session, the meeting reconvened in open

2. RECOMMENDATIONS OF THE JOINT COMMITTEE OF REFERENCE AND LEGISLATIVE ACTION

Ms. Ross reported on the action taken by the Joint Committee of Reference. The Committee's recommendation was to continue the Board for four (4) years, however, only for regulation of Architects, Engineers and Land Surveyors; to re-constitute the membership of the Board from a 9-person board to a 7-person board with two engineers, two architects, two public members and a land surveyor. Further appointments to the Board would require Senate confirmation. It was also recommended, in accordance with the recommendations of the Auditor General's report, that the Board submit a written report to the legislature when the rules were certified, addressing those aspects of rules noted in the audit. The Committee also moved to have legislation prepared reflecting its recommendations and to have that legislation introduced in the Senate.

Mr. Gookin asked how the bill developed by the Board would be handled.

Dr. O'Bannon stated that the Board had several options: (a) to support the Joint Committee's bill and seek to have the Board's "housekeeping" amendments included; (b) to attempt to amend the Joint Committee's bill to include all six professions and the "housekeeping" amendments; or (c) to have the Board's bill introduced in one or both houses but separate from the fight on the constitution of the Board. He stated that he felt the priorities must be to keep the Board alive and to secure adoption of our housekeeping amendments.

Ms. Ross explained that the Board's bill was at the Legislative Council for corrections. She met with the draftperson there, Holly Honeycutt, and provided her with a list of the changes that the Board adopted at the December 4 meeting and Ms. Honeycutt was in the process of incorporating those changes into the draft.

Mr. Palmer wanted to know if there is any other legislation pending that would affect any of our decision-making.

Ms. Ross stated that there is the Senate bill 1016, the Commerce Department bill, designed to incorporate regulatory agencies under an umbrella department.

Mr. Earley wanted to know how the "Common Cause" got involved or interested in the Board.

Ms. Ross stated that "Common Cause" frequently gets involved in with this type of issue. Common Cause is interested in public protection and public access to and representation in governmental decision-making. She noted that it was imperative that the Board take a position with regard to the Joint Committee's bill and the Board's bill.

Mr. Durand asked Mr. Earley for his suggestions.

Mr. Earley stated that this Committee of Reference recommendation came as a complete shock to him. He stated that he thought that he had heard the Board say "one for all, all for one". He expressed concern that no list of "friends and enemies" of the Board had been developed and that no specific legislative strategy had been developed. Ms. Ross responded that at the previous Board meeting, the Board had decided to wait until this meeting to adopt its legislative position and that it was necessary to know that position before a strategy could be developed. She also suggested that while certain legislators may be philosophically opposed to the Board, she would not consider any legislator an "enemy".

Mr. Gookin said that he thought the Board's position was to advocate continuance of the Board as now constituted.

The Board discussed the various options and what needed to be done to achieve them. Chairman O'Bannon recapped the discussion and reviewed what appeared to be the consensus of the Board: (1) The Chairman and the Director would contact Senator Steiner to request inclusion of the housekeeping provisions in the Joint Committee's bill; (2) the Chairman and the Director would contact possible supporters in both houses to request introduction of the Board's bill, continuing all six professions and including the "housekeeping" amendments and (3) then the Board and staff can mobilize to testify and work for the passage of a measure to continue the Board as constituted, with the additional amendments. He entertained a motion to do this. Mr. Riggs moved and it was seconded by Mr. Gookin that we follow the directions as discussed. Motion carried.

Dr. O'Bannon stated that staff should draft short statements outlining the need for continued registration of the professions. Mr. Earley disagreed with Dr. O'Bannon's statement and stated that it was impossible to make adequate arguments in a short statement. He suggested that the different professions could draft statements that could be given to the Board for review and use.

Mr. Durand moved that staff prepare summaries to be used for presenting the Board's position to the Legislature. Seconded by Mr. Earley. Motion passed.

BUDGET

EDECLESSED.

Mr. Earley stated that he had not had any staff input regarding supplemental appropriations. He requested input from staff. Ms. Ross said that a supplemental was being prepared and would be ready for the Budget Committee meeting. Dr. O'Bannon did not feel that it was reasonable to expect financial accounting at each and every Board meeting, when the Board was meeting this frequently.

4. PRESENTATION - ARIZONA SOCIETY OF PROFESSIONAL LAND SURVEYORS

Mr. Jeff Andrews, Chairman, Legislative Committee, A.S.P.L.S.

Mr. Andrews expressed his concern regarding the issue of engineers practicing land surveying on the basis of the inclusion of the word "surveying" in the definition of engineering practice. He urged the Board to act to resolve the issue and submitted a resolution to the Board for its consideration. The resolution contained the following points:

(1) that any prior Attorney General's Opinion addressing the issue be produced, and, if none, that the Board request such;

(2) that the Board's legislative committee study the issue and recommend a

solution by the time of the June meeting; and

(3) that the Executive Director recommend administrative solutions to the problem by the time of the June meeting.

Mr. Durand moved, with a second by Mr. Earley, that the Board adopt the resolution. Mr. Sheets stated that the issue involved a long-standing conflict between the engineers and land surveyors and that the Attorney General has always held the view that engineers have the power to engage in land surveying in this state. To attempt to handle the problem administratively could cause problems, and he recommended that a legislative solution was the best approach.

Mr. Earley again recommended adoption of the motion.

Mr. Riggs expressed his concern with the possible adverse ramifications in our legislative efforts and recommended that the Board address the matter after the Legislature adjourned.

Mr. Palmer stated that he would like to delay the matter and begin discussion in June with a report due in September.

Mr. Durand said he had no objections to the September time frame with regard to points #2 and #3 and amended his motion to adopt the last two points, with the September time frame and with the stipulation that point #1 be tabled for later discussion. Amendment passed. Motion carried.

3. ENFORCEMENT ADVISORY COMMITTEE APPOINTMENTS

Mr. Rosenhan discussed the enforcement committee appointments. He stated that lists, by discipline, of the various committee volunteers had been distributed prior to the December 4 Board meeting. He explained the different lists and recommendations made by Board members. Mr. Rosenhan noted that there would be a training seminar held for the members appointed to the committee.

It was moved by Mr. Earley and seconded by Mr. Brown that the public member of the committee be a non-registrant or a building department member. Motion carried.

Mr. Gookin stated that he felt that the engineering group was too large, unworkable as presented and there would be a problem appointing people. It was moved by Mr. Earley and seconded by Mr. Brown that the Landscape Architect list, as discussed, be adopted. Motion carried.

It was moved by Mr. Brown and seconded by Mr. Earley that the Geologist list, as discussed, be adopted. Motion carried.

It was moved by Mr. Riggs and seconded by Mr. Earley that the Architects' list, as discussed, be adopted. Motion carried.

It was moved by Mr. Durand and seconded by Mr. Earley that the Land Surveyor's list, as discussed, be adopted. Motion carried.

Mr. Palmer moved that the Board accept all the engineers listed. Seconded by Mr. Durand. A substitute motion was made by Mr. Earley to table the list until the next meeting. Seconded by Mr. Gookin. Motion carried.

It was moved by Mr. Gookin and seconded by Mr. Riggs to table the nomination of public members until the next meeting. Motion carried.

It was moved by Mr. Riggs and seconded by Mr. Brown to adjourn the meeting. Motion carried.

The following education and/or experience criteria were developed and applied by the Special Evaluation Committee meeting on October 14, 1981 to applications for registration as professional land surveyors.

EDUCATION:

B.S. Degree in land surveying from a school approved by the Board = 4 years of active engagement.

Other scientific degree or education from a school approved by the Board = 75% of time spent in study (i.e. B.S. in Civil Engineering = 3 years of active engagement.

Time spent in teaching land surveying = maximum l year of active engagement.

EXPERIENCE:

Field work (rodman, chainman, etc.) = 12 months active engagement

Party chief = 12 months active engagement

Construction surveying = 24 months active engagement

Boundary surveying = 36 months active engagement

Office work = 18 months active engagement

Note: While Mr. Durand concurred with these criteria, he reserved the right to revise his opinion.

EXECUTIVE SESSION

It was moved by Mr. Durand and seconded by Mr. Riggs to go into executive session. The Board reconvened in open session after the conclusion of the executive session.

- II. EXAMINATION RESULTS (Attachment #1)
 - A. It was moved by Mr. Gookin and seconded by Mr. Nunn that the results of the professional examinations as noted in Attachment #1 (pp and pp) be adopted and implemented, with those passing all requisite parts placed on the professional grant list and those failing required to retake the necessary parts. Motion carried.
 - B. It was moved by Mr. Gookin and seconded by Mr. Nunn that the results of the in-training examinations as noted in Attachment #1 (pp) be adopted and implemented, with those passing the required parts placed on the in-training grant list and those failing required to retake the necessary parts. Motion carried.
- III. EVALUATION OF APPLICATIONS (Attachment #2)
 - A. Report of the Engineering Evaluation Committee
 - 1. Wayne Allan Ericson: Mr. Gookin questioned the adequacy of Mr. Ericson's engineering experience. Mr. Gookin noted that although Mr. Ericson had taken the 16 hour engineering examination in New Mexico, he was a registered geologist in Arizona and his practical experience was primarily in geology. It was moved by Mr. Brown and seconded by Mr. Durand that registration as a civil engineer be granted Mr. Ericson. Motion carried.

- Eric Laurin: It was moved by Mr. Gookin and seconded by Mr. Riggs that Mr. Laurin be granted registration as a civil engineer. Motion carried.
- John Travers Thompson: It was moved by Mr. Gookin and seconded by Mr. Riggs that Mr. Thompson be granted registration as a civil engineer. Motion carried.
- 4. Frank John Dudek: It was moved by Mr. Gookin and seconded by Mr. Riggs that the application be held and that the applicant be contacted and asked to amend his application to request application as a sanitary engineer or to submit additional information in support of his civil engineering application. Motion carried.
- 5. Edward Dickinson Wright: It was moved by Mr. Gookin and seconded by Ms. Finley that Mr. Wright be held for parts 3 and 4 of the engineering examination. Motion carried.
- B. Report of the Landscape Architectural Evaluation Committee

 Jack Gilbert Anderson: It was moved by Mr. Earley and seconded by Mr.

 Riggs that Mr. Anderson be granted registration as a landscape architect.

 Motion carried.
- C. It was moved by Mr. Riggs and seconded by Mr. Gookin that the names of Mr. Ericson, Mr.Laurin, Mr. Thompson and Mr. Anderson be added to the professional grant list. Motion carried.

IV. GRANTING OF REGISTRATIONS (Attachment #3)

- A. It was moved by Mr. Nunn and seconded by Mr. Riggs that the professional architectural applicants, Vincent Adams through Jerry Young, listed on Attachment 3 (p) be granted registration. Motion carried.
- B. It was moved by Mr. Gookin and seconded by Mr. Nunn that the professional engineering applicants listed on Attachment 3 (pp), including Mr. Ericson, Mr. Laurin and Mr. Thompson, be granted registration, with proficiencies in the branches noted, and that Mr. Anderson be granted registration as a professional landscape architect. Motion carried.
- C. It was moved by Mr. Gookin and seconded by Mr. Durand that the engineer and geologist - in-training applicants shown on Attachment 3 (p) be granted in-training registration. Motion carried.

V. ENFORCEMENT ADVISORY COMMITTEE

The Board considered additions and revisions to previous appointments as well as the public member volunteers nominated by Ms. Finley. The appointments as members and alternates, as confirmed by Board motions, are shown by discipline on Attachment 4, pp

VI. EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT

- A. Introduction of new staff members Ms. Ross introduced Ronald Dalrymple-Investigative Supervisor and Richard Hardaway - Typist III to the Board.
- B. Legislative update Ms. Ross stated that the Senate Bill 1172 had been reported out of the Senate Commerce and Labor Committee and the Board's amendments had been included. As amended, SB 1172 continued the Board as constituted, with all six professions. The other bill that was introduced in the House had not been scheduled for hearing. Ms. Ross further reported that HB 2335, the Supplemental Appropriations request for \$38,400,was awaiting action. The JLBC had recommended \$18,500, and because

of that recommendation and the conservative approach being taken by the Legislature, it was doubtful that the Board would receive the amount requested. Also, she noted that many agencies budgets were being cut 10% below the current year's appropriations and that the 1982-83 budget request could expect severe scrutiny. Ms. Finley discussed SB 2339 regarding the Attorney General's responsibilities toward Boards and Commissions and stated that she felt that the Board should be concerned with the bill as presently constituted. Mr. Earley moved that the Board adopt and communicate to the Legislature its opposition to the bill as proposed. It was seconded by Ms. Finley. Motion carried with 7 yes's and 1 abstention (Mr. Riggs)

C. RULES

Mr. Nunn reviewed the accomplishments of the Rules Committee during the last three months and noted that review of the engineering registration criteria had been delayed due to the absence of engineering members.

It was requested by Mr. Earley that the budget be placed on the agenda for the next meeting.

D. BUDGET, CONTRACTS

Ms. Ross reviewed all expenses with the Board and copies of budget projections were distributed. It was requested by Fir. Palmer that the information be given to the Board members before the next meeting so they would have adequate time to review it and ask questions. Ms. Ross reviewed the investigative contracts, informing the Board that 5 bidders had expressed interest. After interviewing the bidders, contracts were awarded to 4 of the 5.

March 19 will be the next regular meeting of the Board and Mr. Palmer expressed a desire to have a spot on the agenda to review a number of items. Dr. O'Bannon stated that the meeting will be in the Kiva Room at UA and material will be sent to the Board. Mr. Earley requested minutes of all previous meetings. He also requested tangible evidence be given to Joyce Smith of the Board's appreciation. Seconded by Mr. Gookin. Motion carried.

Mr. Durand questioned whether enforcement meetings had been stopped because of legal advice. Ms. Ross stated that there has been no stopping of enforcement action; advisory committee meetings had been temporarily suspended both to allow for reappointment of committees and to permit investigation and documentation of cases.

It was moved by Mr. Nunn and seconded by Mr. Earley that the meeting be adjourned. Motion carried.

7. REPORT OF THE LEGISLATIVE COMMITTEE

- A. Report on the status of SB 1172 Mr. Palmer asked Ms. Ross to report to the Board on the status of SB 1172. Ms. Ross stated that SB 1172 will be before the TP & O committee on Monday, March 22 at 1:45 pm. Ms. Ross informed the Board that there has been concern about the possibility of a fight before the committee as a result of some proposed amendments by certain engineering societies and others. Hopefully, this can be avoided. It was moved by Mr. Gookin and seconded by Ms. Finley that a letter be sent to the Senate expressing the Board's concern regarding SB 1379. Motion carried.
- B. Report on the status of budget and supplemental request.

 Ms. Ross discussed the budget request and stated that the supplemental bill was to be discussed this morning in Senate appropriations. An amendment to the supplemental would be proposed in committee to reduce the \$38,400 reflected in the House version of HB 2335 to \$32,700. Ms. Ross indicated she felt the amendment would pass.
- 8 REPORT OF THE BUDGET COMMITTEE
 - Mr. Earley turned the meeting over to Ms. Ross to discuss actual and projected expenditures. She stated that, based on expenditure patterns, the Board would have to reduce expenditures for the remainder of the fiscal year; however, until the Legislature acted on the Supplemental request, how much reduction would be necessary was unknown. She reviewed the various expenditure items and requested direction from the Board. After discussion, the Board directed staff to monitor expenditures, limit non-essential items and report back to the Board when more current information is available. Ms. Finley moved to suspend all out-of-state travel until such time as the Board has available more concrete projections. Mr. Durand seconded the motion. Motion carried.
- REPORT OF THE PUBLIC INFORMATION COMMITTEE

 Report from Mr. Nunn on Western Conference Meeting, State Architectural Board.

 Mr. Nunn reported on his attendance at the conference and the discussions concerning the examination. He stated that NCARB was studying methods of streamlining the exam and ensuring that the exams are verifiable. The exams are to modified in 1984. Mr. Nunn also reported that he was elected to a two year term on the West MCARB executive committee.
- Ms. Ross reviewed the operational and administrative problems confronting the staff, including such items as the antiquated filing system, the lack of automation and consequent problems with manual files; the difficulties of accurate budget forecasting and proper accounting given the bookkeeping system utilized; the increasing demands created by the enforcement process; the time required to respond to telephone inquiries; the time required to prepare for Board meetings and to transcribe minutes; etc. She stated that the staff deserved commendation for the work done, and that while progress was being made in correcting the past deficiencies, it was slow because staff resources were being stretched just to keep pace with the day-to-day operations of the agency. Given the fact that there appeared to be no chance of additional positions next year, problems would persist.

11. UNFINISHED BUSINESS

The Board was referred to the transcription, contained in the November 5 minutes, of the motion relating to the stipulation to grant no further land surveyor registrations until a decision had been rendered in Superior Court. At the request of Mr. Durand, the tape recording of the motion was replayed. The Board agreed the transcription was accurate.

12. NEW BUSINESS

- A. Mr. Gookin requested that staff work with the ASPE to allow engineering certificates to be presented at a banquet held by the organization. The Board concurred.
- B. Mr. Gookin discussed his concerns with the NCEE grading process. Mr. Durand suggested that staff write a letter to NCEE expressing the Board's concern that NCEE make a strong effort to ensure consistency in grading since the Board was placed in the position of defending the scores.
- C. Mr. Palmer-reviewed a variety of items with which he was concerned:
 - (1) He requested that an up-date on enforcement activities be given at each meeting.
 - (2) He expressed concern over the delay in producing minutes. Ms. Finley moved that staff be directed to simplify the minutes to include only the motions made; to delete the substance of discussion, unless specifically requested by a Board member; and to delete copies of evaluation committee reports and grant lists from Board members' copies of minutes. According to the Code of the State Board of Technical Registration, the applicant must have at least eight years of experience in which each year of study satisfactorily completed in an engineering school, approved by the board up to a maximum of five years, may be considered equivalent to one year of active engagement. The following is my experience.

Engineering Study: 4 years (From May 1972 to Nov. 1975) Engineering Practice: 6.2 years (From Jan. 1976 to Present) Total Experience: 10.2 years

While practicing engineering full time, I studied part-time in the evening to obtain my master degree from 1976 through May 1979. I think the Committee evaluated my experience as follows:

I was recently informed that my application for my Professional Engineering exam and registration has been delayed for six months due to lack of experience. According to your calculations I will be one month short on experience by the date of the exam. I feel however, that this is more than compensated by the semester that I taught at Yavapai Junior College while I was also working for Cyprus Bagdad, and by the part time work that I performed in college. I also feel the quality of the experience that I have had, which covers operations, teaching and engineering work, is broader and more intensive than is usually the case.

I would also like to point out that when I took the E. I. T. exam we were told that in four years we would be able to take the P. E. exam. It will have been four years in April 1982 and I believe that I am ready to take the P. E. exam. I feel that my present conduct and abilities reflect the necessary maturity and experience to maintain the integrity of the Engineering Profession. Having one month's additional experience will do little towards making me more professional than I am now.

I therefore would like to appeal your delay of my application and be allowed to take the P. E. Exam in April 1982 instead of unecessarily waiting until October of 1982.

CHAPTER I_LANDMARKS AND SURVEYS

ARTICLE 1. IN GENERAL

§ 33-105. Recording of certain land surveys; contents

- A. A land surveyor shall file a record of a land survey not later than ninety days after its completion, with the county recorder of the county where the land is located if such survey establishes points or lines relating to land boundaries or property lines disclosing:
- A material discrepancy which, in whole or in part, does not appear on any map or record previously recorded or filed with the county recorder, county engineer, state highway engineer t or the United States bureau of land management.
- 2. Evidence that, by reasonable analysis, might result in alternate positions of lines or points,
- B. The record of survey shall be a reproducible map, legibly drawn, printed or reproduced by a process assuring a permanent record as required by § 11-481.
 - C. The record of survey map shall show:
- 1. All monuments found, set, removed, reset or replaced, the kind, size and location of such monuments and all other data relating to such monuments.
- Bearing and length of lines to the nearest one one-hundredth of a foot and ties to witness monuments. Other record data may be shown in chains, varue or other types of measurement as implemented by older surveys.
- 3. Basis of bearings, north arrow or other means of orientation, and scale of map.
- Name or designation of tract or grant in which the survey is located, and ties to adjoining tracts or grants.
- 5. Any other data necessary for the intelligent interpretation of the various items and locations of the points, lines and areas shown.
- 6. Dates of survey.

§ 33-106. Corner record survey; filing; contents

A. A land surveyor shall complete, sign and file or cause to be filed with the county recorder of the county in which the corner is situated, a written record of the establishment or restoration of public land corners as established by endastral surveys of the United States general land office or United States hareau of land management, inclining those monuments design

nating boundaries of land grants, military reservations, government and Indian reservations, land patents and mining patents, including also those monuments established as mineral monuments by an authorized United States mineral surveyor. The survey information shall be filed within thirty days after the survey is completed, unless the corner and its accessories are substantially as described in an existing corner record previously filed.

- B. 'The corner record shall include the following:
- 1. A report, by sketch or narration, or both, concerning ties to existing monuments presumed authentic.
- 2. Acceptable monuments found in a parishable or deteriorated condition, a description of what was found and actions taken for the rehabilitation or perpetuation of the monument by the surveyor making such report.
- 3. New monuments set in a position occupied by an old monument, a description of the new monument as to material, shape, marking, projection above the surface of the ground, distance buried below the ground surface, disposition of the old monument and related items.
- The procedure followed, by sketch and narration, in recstablishing the corner reported if no acceptable evidence of the original monument or its location can be found.
- A description of the monument set to perpetuate the corner as reestablished and reported, indicating any hearing trees or objects noted in the general vicinity of the new monument.
- The location and nature of all reference monuments or objects which would be useful in the identification, recovery or reestablishment of any monument referred to in such report.
- 7. Acceptable monuments found with reference monuments, accessories and general surroundings materially differing from the information contained in previous corner records. The conditions observed in the survey which materially differ from the original recordation shall be clearly reported by sketch and narration.
- C. The county recorder shall keep proper indices of such corner records by the name of grant, tract, subdivision or cadastral subdivisions by United States bureau of land management or general land office. As amended Laws 1974, Ch. 68, § 15.

- D. Special Board Evaluations

At its meeting of December 4, 1981, the Board deferred action on the following applications, pending receipt of verbal advice from the Assistant Attorney General regarding the interpretation of ARS 32-126. Mr. Sheets has advised the Board that an applicant may be granted registration without examination if he or she holds a valid certificate of registration from another state or foreign country which has or had registration requirements substantially identical to those of Arizona at the time the initial registration was granted.

(1) Courtland Price Paul, Landscape Architectural Applicant #81-608

Mr. Paul was registered as a Landscape Architect in California in 1954 on the basis of education and experience. Arizona did not require registration of Landscape Architects until 1968. When registration was mandated in 1968, the original law

provided that, at any time within one year of the effective date of the article, the Board could certify for registration any applicant who submitted proof acceptable to the Board that the applicant had had at least seven years of practice in landscape architecture as defined in ARS 32-101 as a principal livelihood, of which at least one year shall have been in Arizona as a resident. Mr. Sheets has previously advised that the residency requirement in the statute is not a material factor in considering equivalent requirements.

- Mr. Robeson holds a BSEE degree from Purdue. He was registered as an EIT in Indiana on 7/31/59 on the basis of an 8-hour NCEE examination. He has never taken the professional examination nor has he held any professional registration. He applied for registration in Arizona on 6/10/81, seeking such registration under R4-30-16, the Comprehensive Oral Examination. At the time of his application, although R4-30-16 had not been officially repealed, the Board required professional registration applicants
- (3) John F. Barnaby, Mechanical Engineering Applicant #81-400

to take Parts 3 and 4.

Mr. Barnaby indicates he received his initial registration in 1956 as a Mechanical Engineer in Massachusetts. He further state that he was registered in 1957 in New Hampshire on the basis of reciprocity and in 1958 in Maine by oral examination. However, all three of these registrations are inactive. His only active registration at the time of his application was in Connecticut. He stipulates that it was granted in 1970 by oral examination; however, the Connecticut Board attests that he was registered in 1973 under a Grandfather Clause. Also, according to the Connecticut Board, his registration was to expire 1/3/82, but the Board was unable to confirm whether the registration had been renewed. He holds no degree and has never taken any written examinations. In neither 1970 nor 1973 did Arizona have an active Grandfather Clause for engineers.

(4) Barton B. Wallace, Jr. Mechanical Engineering Applicant #81-400

Mr. Wallace has a BS in Mechanical Engineering from Texas A & M and holds an active registration as a Professional Engineer in Texas. The Texas registration was granted in 1952 on the basis of education and experience. At the time that registration was granted, Mr. Wallace appears to have had the eight years of education and experience then required under Arizona law. He has never taken any written examinations. Although Arizona did administer engineering examinations in 1952, a review of the minutes seems to indicate that the Board, at that time, did exercise discretion in waiving examination requirements.

(5) Hironmay Banerjee, Electrical Engineering Applicant #81-297

Mr. Banerjee holds a BS degree (1950) in Mechanical and Electrical Engineering from Banaras Hindu University, a MS degree (1956) in Electrical Engineering from the University of Wisconsin and a Ph.D (1962) in Electrical Engineering from the Imperial College, University of London. He was registered as a "Chartered Engineer" with the Institute of Electrical Engineers in 1962 on the basis of education and experience. He has taken no written examinations. Although he had eight years of education and experience at the time of his registration in 1962, all of his experience was academic, as a lecturer and professor. From a review of the minutes, it appears that the rules in effect in 1962 provided for a 5-part examination (Part 5 being the Personal Audience), but that the Board could waive any one part, or combination of parts 1, 2, 3 or 4, if the Board was satisfied that the applicant was fully qualified to practice the profession of engineering in the branch specified. However, the law in 1962 allowed the Board to credit a maximum of five years toward the requisite eight for a combination of education and teaching.

(6) Melvin J. Kohn, Civil Engineering Applicant #81-656

Mr. Kohn has a BS degree in Mechanical Engineering (1949) from Rutgers. He holds a valid registration as a Civil Engineer in New Jersey, granted in 1972 on the basis of an oral examination/ interview and a valid registration in Texas as a Professional Engineer, granted in 1976 on the basis of education and experience. He has submitted a NCEE Record. He has taken no written examinations. Ms. Finley did not see what the problem would be as they are granted under reciprocity and it is a different category.

Mr. Brown stated that we have three members on the Committee approving the applicants and now two of them are objecting. He wondered what was going on. Mr. Riggs stated that he felt that we should grant the applicants registration because they are qualifying under a different set of conditions than the ones that are involved in the lawsuit. Mr. Durand stated that he feels all applicants should be treated as a group and not treated separately. Mr. Riggs stated that according to both the old and new laws we are required to give part 4 of the examination.

Mr. Palmer wanted to know what the recommendation of the Committee was and if Mr. Durand had sent copies of the minutes to the staff. Ms. Ross stated she had called Mr. Durand and that he was not available; she called Mr. Riggs and asked him, based on his copies of the minutes that she never received, verified that each of these people were indeed a recommended registrant. Then she called Mr. Durand and told him what was recommended. Mr. Sheets asked Mr. Durand if he had voted against all the applicants at the committee meeting that were recommended. Ms. Ross stated that as a matter of fact, he had not.

Mr. Durand requested that we table such action on the motion until we hear from the Land Surveyor Association; seconded by Mr. Palmer. Roll call vote to table action on the motion: Dr. O'Bannon, no; Mr. Brown, no; Ms. Finley, yes; Mr. Palmer, yes; Mr. Nunn, no; Mr. Durand, yes; Mr. Riggs, no. MOTION TO TABLE FAILED.

VI. REPORT OF THE RULES COMMITTEE:

Ms. Ross reported that the Committee is attempting to condense the engineering requirements, continuing to recognize the branches. They are attempting to condense the Code of Ethics and will try to do an emergency packet of the rules to hold the Board for 90 days. There will be a Rules Committee meeting called next week. They will be getting the emergency packet ready for the September meeting.

VII. REPORT OF THE BUDGET COMMITTEE:

Ms. Ross explained the budget report. She explained that instead of paying \$2,500 for printing of the Code, the State is going to do it for approximately \$800. Ms. Ross explained the 1982-83 budget appropriations, and the amounts appropriated in the three categories - Enforcement, Licensing and Lump Sum. She explained that the \$110,000 is not enough to cover staff salaries, plus Board expenses. We are looking at a minimum of \$120,000 in salaries; probably several thousand more in Board expenses, plus about \$25,000 in employee related benefits.

Mr. Jeff Andrews addressed the Board and stated that there had been a joint meeting between the Land Surveyors Association and the Engineers and that the societies would lobby for the Board and their appropriations in exchange for some changes that they would like to see done.

Ms. Ross informed the Board that for the next two months she and the Committee will be working on the 1983-84 budget.

VIII. PUBLIC COMMENT:

Mr. Curtis Drew, from APLS, stated that all they are asking is for the Board to move forward with speed and process these applications. They are getting input from some of them about the infamous 61; calls are continually coming in from people whose licenses have been held up and they can sympathize with them. Some of them are association members, but they cannot take a position other than that they want to see everything occur in a legal and correct manner so they are asking that the Board take that into consideration. APLS will be monitoring the action of the Board and they feel that they can work with the Board and solve this problem for all concerned. They are not, as some people have claimed, trying to restrain trade.

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Chairman O'Bannon asked Mr. Drew what they would like the Board to do. He questioned Mr. Drew regarding his feelings on the completion of the lawsuit. Mr. Drew informed the Board that they had been informed time after time that new applicants were being evaluated under the old criteria and registration was going to be granted under the old criteria and not the new law or criteria adopted by the courts.

Chairman O'Bannon questioned Mr. Drew regarding his position on the 61 registrants that were granted registration in November. Mr. Drew stated that he had made his position clear in a letter that he had sent to all Board members. His position is that those 61 applicants are in some way innocent bystanders; he would like to see them retain their licenses; he would like personally to see them examined on the basis of what had happened prior to last September and what can happen after this April.

Chairman O'Bannon asked if Mr. Drew's position was to not grant them license, as we did on November 5, and asked if he were opposing that. Mr. Drew stated that he was opposing the method of the actions of the Board, and that the Association is opposing the action of the Board on November 5th. Mr. Drew was questioned as to whether they are planning to appeal the minute entry. He stated they hadn't made that decision.

Mr. Greengard, the attorney for the Land Surveyors, requested permission to speak. He stated that the question was raised as to what the Association wanted the Board to do. What they would have the Board do is to formulate proper rules in accordance with the Arizona Procedural Act and in accordance with Senate Bill 1172. On the other hand, if the Board tries to license without adopting proper rules and regulations, they will be right back in court as many times as it takes to resolve the issue. It is that simple.

Mr. Sheets stated that but for the legal time that they have had to spend on this litigation, the rules would have been adopted probably three or four months ago. This litigation has been one of the prime reasons why this Board does not have rules it badly needs on the books. He wanted this statement clearly on the public record.

Chairman O'Bannon thanked Mr. Drew for his presence at the Board meeting.

Mr. Jeffrey Andrews - With regard to the reciprocity actions that were taken on Land Surveyors today, he did not have a problem with any of the specific individuals that were licensed as he did not have any knowledge of their circumstances. He stated that nearly every other state that licenses land surveyors, they review those particular candidates for licenses by reciprocity for their knowledge of state laws regarding land surveying in that state. There is no national examination that is applicable to the continental United States with regard to land surveying. He believes that it is an unusual profession in that regard. Most of the other professions can be blanket licensed by reciprocity. Land Surveying

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is not that way and he is opposed to see this Board adopt a policy of continually granting licensing by reciprocity based on the mere fact that individuals completed a four part examination in their first state of registration. He believes an Arizona exam is appropriate; it has been appropriate in the past and he does not see any reason why it can't be appropriate in the future. He believes if due consideration wasn't given to the 13 people licensed today of their knowledge about state and local laws in the land surveying profession in Arizona, it was a grave miscarriage of action by the Board.

Mr. Nunn stated that in Architecture in certain localities they have the same situation with earthquake seismic exam. They are trying to combine the seismic, wind force and permaforce, and they are trying to come up with another part of the National exam that would acceptable to reciprocity nation wide. Mr. Nunn wanted to know what was so different about the requirements in Arizona.

Chairman O'Bannon stated he cannot see why the professional coming into another state would not make himself aware of the difference between his state and another state's law. Mr. Palmer expressed his problem with uniformity between the various professionals. He stated that the Mechanical and Structural Engineers deal with something dangerous and they have to go out and check their own local laws. He has trouble balancing national examinations with their own profession because there is absolutely nothing in the mechanical test or codes on codes, laws, rules or regulations.

IX. REPORT OF THE LEGISLATIVE COMMITTEE:

Mr. Palmer reported that they would be bringing a report to the Board at the September 10, meeting. They propose to draft a change and then submit it to the societies for their comments, receive back their comments and then put together a composite of their comments and bring that report back to the Board on September 10. He requested a reaffirmation from the Board that they are to proceed with this action at which time they will go ahead and then try and draft something. If the Board has a meeting in a couple of weeks, they will have it at that time and it can be placed on the agenda. The special meeting will be August 13, 1982.

X. ENFORCEMENT ACTION:

Inclosed is an application for the Architect-in-Training program and a personal check for the required fees.

Please register me for the upcoming examinations scheduled for this June.

I request that I be granted Architect-in-Training status with the requirement for the qualification examination being waived.

I request waiver of the qualifying examination for the following reasons:

- 1. When I received my Master of Architecture from Harvard University's Graduate School of Design in 1976 the general policy of the NCARB and the NAAB was to allow those applicants who had a Master's degree (accredited professionally) to be excused from the qualifying examination. These were the rules I expected to work under and which I have in good faith assumed to be applicable.
- 2. I have worked steadily towards attaining the experience and expertise required to attain professional licensure during the years since I received my Architecture Degree except for the time I took out to attend Vanderbilt University's Owen Graduate School of Management to obtain an MBA. This goal was, in my own mind, an essential part of the preparation needed to be a successful practitioner of Architecture as a Business and a Profession as well as an Art. I was encouraged and aided in coming to this understanding by several members of the Design faculty when I was an Architectural student and the goal of also attaining an MBA was an integral part of my career ambitions from the very beginning.
- 3. The states I was living and working in prior to moving to Arizona, Indiana and Tennessee, (I was living in Tennessee in order to attend Vanderbilt, not to practice Architecture) did not have an AIT program for Degree prepared candidates that was any different than Arizona's at that time, i.e., the primary purpose of AIT was for gaining education and Registration by apprenticeship and Master's Degree holders were excused from the qualifying examination. Dear Sir or Madam:

I am writing to respectfully request that the Board consider waiving the requirement that I retake the Architectural History and Theory Portion of the Architectural Qualifying Examination.

In 1979, I applied for my architectural license and registration in the State of Arizona. Prior to moving to the United States and Arizona in 1975, I had received my degree in architecture from the University of Budapest in Hungary in 1968. I became a licensed architect in my native country and worked for approximately one and a half years prior to emigrating to the United States. Before I received my architectural license in Hungary, I passed a rigorous examination covering all pertinent areas of professional qualifications, including the subject of Architectural History and Theory, on which I received a rating of "excellent".

When applying for my Arizona registration, I spoke to Mr. Kemper and Mr. Edson, both at that time members of the Board. Pursuant to their request, I obtained an official transcript of my course of architectural study at the University of Budapest, a transcript of my professional examination in Hungary and an official translation of said materials. During the time that the Board evaluated my qualifications, we had at least four meetings trying to determine whether or not I would be required to take the Qualifying Examination. The decision as to whether or not I had to take the Qualifying Examination was, as you know, within the full discretion of the Board. It was finally determined that, because not enough was known about the professional and scholastic standing of my university and about the Hungarian Architectural License, I would be required to take the Qualifying Examination to demonstrate my personal qualifications again to become registered as an architect in Arizona, even though I felt that the University from which I graduated was one of the top schools of architecture in the world, having been in existence for several hundred years, with such graduates as Laszlo Moholy Nagy, Leo Szilard and Breuer Marcel, all prominent in the field of architecture, I did not take issue with the Board's decision.

Along with the Qualifying Examination, I took and passed "Part A" of the required Professional Examination. I also passed the structural building materials, and environmental portions of the Qualifying Examination, but did not pass the history portion of the examination.

At present, I am actively pursuing my profession in Phoenix, Arizona, and have my own company, LTD Architecture, Inc. I am in business with Douglas D. Stroh, under whose license the business operates. It is my desire that I be allowed to take "Part B" of the Professional Examination, in December of 1982, in order that I can become a registered architect in the State of Arizona. Before I can take the remaining part of the Professional Examination, I must successfully complete the History Portion of the Qualifying Examination, which, as I stated, I failed to pass two years ago.

As I am sure you are aware, the basis of the Architectural History and Theory is international in scope rather than local or regional in scope. Any examination in the area of Architectural History and Theory requires a fresh knowledge of detailed and minute facts concerning this area. This is something which recent university graduates have fresh in their minds and are able to recall with little trouble.

In 1969, I was a recent university graduate and took a registration examination in Hungary, which included the area of Architectural History and Theory, which, as stated earlier, I received a grade of "excellent". I have been working and applying my architectural skills and knowledge for over twelve years and feel that I have demonstrated a good background in the area of Architectural History and Theory through its' practical application on the job.

As I have stated, I am now engaged in my own business, earning my living in the field of architecture in Arizona. The demands of my business on my time and attention are overwhelming. I feel that my first obligation is to the firm's clients, who are very pleased with my abilities and my work product. It would be very difficult, if not impossible, for me to take the time away from my profession to read and study all of the materials necessary to refresh my recollection of all of the details which one must know in order to successfully complete the History and Theory Portion of the Qualifying Examination. I have already successfully completed all portions of the examination which require a day to day practical application in my profession. The face that I passed Architectural History and Theory some years ago together with the fact that not all architectural graduates are re-

quired to take the Qualifying Examination in Arizona, and that the Board had considerable trouble in exercising its' discretion in the first instance as to whether I should take the Qualifying Examination at all, should be considered in my request to have the Board waive the requirement that I take the History and Theory Portion of the Qualifying Examination before moving on the "Part B" of the Professional Examination.

I know that I could again pass the History and Theory Portion of the Qualifying Examination if I had the time to study and prepare for it. The ultimate purpose of this phase of the examination is to demonstrate one's ability to adopt one's background knowledge in this area of study to a present day to day practical application. This I feel I have done, although time has faded my recollection of the details and trivia required for successful completion of this area of the examination.

It is not my intention to obtain special dispensation from what is squired of me to become licensed as an architect in Arizona. The whole purpose of my request is to obtain the approval necessary for me to take "Part B" of the Professional Examination, which I am certain I can pass on my own merit.

Please consider my request to waive the registration requirement that I retake and pass the History and Theory Portion of the Qualifying Examination on the basis of my past and present qualifications and the considerable hardships that requiring me to prepare for the examination would place upon myself and my active participation in the profession during these difficult economic times.

I again respectfully request that the Board review my credentials and waive the requirement that I take the History and Theory Portion of the Qualifying Examination as part of my registration requirements, thus allowing me to take "Part B" of the Professional Examination in December.

We have been asked by some Alumni of Landscape Architecture to write to you. Our purpose is to explain the curricular changes in Landscape Architecture from the Bachelor of Science in Agriculture (B.S.) degree to the professional Bachelor of Landscape Architecture (B.L.A.) degree in the mid-1970's.

In early 1975, the Landscape Architecture faculty began discussion to produce a five-year B.L.A. curriculum. The B.S. in Agriculture with a major in Landscape Architecture was in effect at that time.

In November of 1975, the five-year B.L.A. curriculum was approved. Although the first graduates received a B.L.A. degree on December 31, 1975 they were not five-year people but had, in fact, completed a four-year curriculum.

The first students to begin the full five-year B.L.A. curriculum were admitted in August of 1976.

Confusion arises because the University of Arizona issues a General Catalogue every two years. A new Catalogue was published for the 1975-76, 1976-77 period. The five-year B.L.A. curriculum was approved in November of 1975, too late for the Catalogue.

Therefore, those students who entered Landscape Architecture during the 1975 year of change were caught in a four-year B.L.A. curriculum (1975-76 only) rather than a five-year curriculum.

Yet most of those students who entered during the 1975 year had several units of transfer credit, and since the degree designation - B.L.A. - was a professional one many assumed that they would get credit for five years of education.

However, the four-year B.L.A. degree (1975-76 only) required only 134 units whereas the five-year B.L.A. required 164 units.

Technically, the Board is right in looking at the number of units required the degree, even though many of the students have more than the 134 units. The misunderstanding arose because those Alumni who were in that one class assumed they would receive educational credit for all of their College or University work - not just that in Landscape Architecture. They were, in some

cases, of the opinion that theirs was a five-year curriculum because it took them five or six years of College or University work.

Since this matter may arise again next year, we will list the names of all of those students who graduated on May 19, 1979. These students will, in most instances, have accomplished the four-year B.L.A. curriculum:

I am in receipt of your May 27, 1982 letter advising me that the Engineering Evaluation Committee recommends that my application for Civil Engineer be denied for lack of experience. The committee recommends that I secure four more years of experience.

The letter does not specify the type of experience that the committee is recommending, therefore, I am requesting that the board reconsider my application. My experience includes seventeen (17) years of supervising highway construction projects that have included the work of roads, bridges and water works (storm drains, sewers, waterlines, wells, etc.). Approximately 75 percent of this time is spent on design evaluation, plan and specification requirement compliance and making the necessary field changes required by contract engineering supervision. The other 25 percent is spent on contract administration. All of this work is classified as Civil Engineering. The CODE of the State Board of Technical Registration, Article 2, Registration 32-122 qualification of applicant: states that an applicant for engineering registration needs eight (8) years experience meets this requirement.

The board has established a president in approving past applicants with less total experience than what I have shown on my application. I feel that with this in mind I should be allowed to take the Civil Engineer examination.

The State of Arizona no longer accepts the Highway Engineer registration and I feel that by registering as a Civil Engineer that it would enhance my position with the Arizona Department of Transportation. Also other states do not recognize the Highway Engineer registration.

4. Out-of-State registrants to attend one of the above lectures, prior to using his seal in Arizona, unless he has been registered more than 12 years in any state and has been actively using his seal in that state for a minimum of 4 years.

News Letters:

- A. The necessity for communication with registrant is imperative to inform them of:
 - 1. Board action.
 - 2. Enforcement action.
 - 3. Changes in law.
 - 4. Changes in rules.
 - 5. Interpretation of rules and laws.
 - 6. General information.
 - 7. Advise to City Building Inspectors on new registrants.
- B. Letters to be sent at least twice a year.
- C. Finance. If the present fees charged to registrants is not ample then increase the fees to provide this service.
- D. This is a method of informing the nearly 11,000 registrants of the board action so the registrant is better informed on the above listed functions.
- E. Better communications should decrease the minor enforcement procedures and may also reduce any major proceedings.

Public Relation:

- A. The board and staff should submit to news media a list of new registrants. Enforcement actions (at appropriate time), and changes in the law and rules.
- B. A publication should be written on the board, its duties, who we register and why. This should be sent to newly elected state officers and others where it would be useful. It should be short but complete and easy to read. It should explain why registration is necessary to protect the health, welfare and safety of the public.

Use of Seal:

- A. Changes have occured in reproduction methods which requires some consideration on the use of the seal.
- B. Printed seals on transparent materials may be permanently attached to drawings providing the signature is on the original tracing or each print made from the tracing.
- C. Seals printed on drawing sheet are acceptable.
- D. The original completed tracing must bear the registrants seal and signature. Overlay printing of backgrounds is acceptable providing the original work performed by the registrant is sealed and signed.

Use of Seal: (Cont)

- E. The signature over a seal must allow the registrants name, certificate number, to be legible. This also applies to the seals reproduction.
- F. New seals should be issued to anyone having the old seal that indicates the experation date of December 31, 19_.

Green Summary Evaluation Forms:

A. In order to reduce staffs time it is recommended that references and experence not be included. The paraphrasing is subjective and does not always represent the true intent of the writer. It is also time consuming. It is suggested the evaluation committee review these items from the original response. These items could be highlighted in the file so they could be easily located. This could be done by using a distinctive colored paper.

We would like to enquire into the possibilities of having the field and office experience of our survey personnel count towards the minimum experience to take the registered land surveyor examination in your State. We have discussed this matter with several state surveyors and they suggested we contact you, with some background information on our work, for a decision. First, as a registered surveyor (Florida and Alaska) I fully understand the need for a solid background in the technical and legal aspects of land (i.e., boundary) surveying along with a firm education in a particular state's land laws and procedures. We are not seeking to have a full eight years of required field experience for land surveyor be accrued in geophysical work but would like to have a portion of the requirement, say perhaps up to a maximum of four years be credited for our type of surveyors. Being both a survey supervisor and a registered land surveyor, I have had requests from many of our surveyors as to how they might become registered since many of them have had previous land surveying experience and several reside in your state. Our survey work is basically in the fields of control, hydrographic, and topographic mapping with a limited amount of land surveying to the extent that boundary corners must be relocated in order to ascertain ownership prior to the actual geophysical exploration project commencing. With this in mind, I would like to submit a brief description of what our typical field surveyor accomplishes along with their background and duties.

Our survey personnel in the field are divided into four categories which closely parallel the classifications of survey personnel in private practice. These personnel are attached to a self-sufficient geophysical exploration/mapping party and can be classed as follows:

Survey Helper - This is basically the same, in duties, training and experience as a "rodman".

- This classification starts about the same as a senior "chainman" but most would be described as an instrumentman". It is at this stage that serious technical training begins.

Second Surveyor - This is a responsible position and might be classified as a "junior party chief".

Depending upon experience, this person would be in charge of the less-difficult field surveys, act as relief for a lead surveyor during vacations, etc.

Lead Surveyor - This is the fully-qualified survey party chief who is responsible for an entire survey operation.

Geophysical Service Inc. is the only geophysical exploration firm that offers both resident and correspondence inhouse training programs to their survey personnel. This is in addition to fully refunded tuition and books to any personnel desiring to take college-level resident or correspondence courses. Almost all of our survey personnel are graduates of at least the first two of the following three resident courses and most have completed the in-house Plane Survey correspondence course. We offer our personnel the following full-time (40 hours/week for 4-8 weeks in Dallas) training courses: (1) Survey Trainee, (2) Plane Surveying, and (3) Advanced (Control/Geodetic) Surveying.

Due to the frequently remote areas that our work is in, both inside the U.S. and overseas, our field surveyors must not only deal with the client but must arrange for instrumentation, transportation, perform control research (using both local and national sources with foreign areas frequently not being in English) reconnaissance, land ownership research, and a field determination of land boundary lines (with ties from his survey lines to property corners and to corners of the U.S., Public Land Survey system).

Since our work is mainly related to topographic and geologic mapping a control survey is usually necessary prior to the mapping surveys. In the U.S., this usually begins and closes on corners of the U.S. Geological Survey, National Geodetic Survey, or some other reliable agency and may involve traverses of 20-30 miles between the control point and the survey areas. In the U.S., all work is performed on the state Plane Coordinate System while in foreign areas the UTM grid is used or, as is the case in Saudi Arabia, Mexico, Sumatra, and Brunei, we work on geographic positions (i.e., latitude and longitude). For control purposes, in the U.S. a horizontal accuracy of 1:10,000 and third-order elevations are maintained. In foreign areas, the degree of accuracy achieved is usually determined by the national network of the host country.

Since this is frequently inferior or when adequate basic control is not available, our personnel will establish their own primary network based on the Transit satellite positioning technique, inertial positioning system or by celestial observations. Once the initial control has been brought into an areas, the mapping is performed with closing accuracies (from one control point to another) of at least 1:5000 horizontally and third-order vertically.

Those of our surveyors who I would consider to be of the caliber to be considered for partial land survey credit are trained and experienced in the following instrumentation:

Theodolites - (Wild T-1, T-2, T-w, T-4, Zeiss TH-2)

Electronic Distance Measurement - K&E "Autoranger",
Tellurometer CA-1000
Cubic DM-40 & 20.

Total Stations - H.P. 3820, Zeiss "Elta", K&E "Vectron"

Transits - These are presently being phases out in favor of theodolites and total stations.

- These, also, are being phased our in favor of coordinate (angle/distance) surveys and are presently only used when specifically requested by the client.

Compasses - Used only on client request or to retrace old survey lines that were originally done by compass.

Satellites - Used to establish primary control points in areas economically too far (in the U.S.) from existing national control however it is used extensively overseas.

- These system, such as ARGO, Miniranger, Del Norte, etc. are used extensively in our near-shore hydrographic surveys.

Inertial Positioning - This is a system we are just starting to utilize and we have been instrumental in developing new applications, along with the software for this technique.

The final phase of our surveyor's work is in the data reduction and preparation of the final product. Due to our parties being, literally, scattered throughout the world, the field survey personnel perform their own office calculations. This normally encompasses adjustments and calculations (of coordinates, etc.) for traverses, triangulation, trilateration, vertical control, etc.,

using the TI-59 calculator and TI-770 computer with which each party is equiped. When required by the client, the surveyor also plots and drafts mylar maps and submits written reports.

I hope this will give you an idea of the extend and scope of work performed by geophysical surveyors. When working as a land surveyor, I had never heard of this type of work, so perhaps you have found it enlightening. Geophysical Service Inc. is the largest exploration firm of this type in the world, having about 120 field parties in over 20 countries, and is striving to set ever higher standards for the industry. It is with this in mind that we would like to encourage those of our surveyors who are otherwise qualified to seek professional registration. I would like to have your generalized opinion of the merits or our type of work before encouraging anyone to apply. To repeat my earlier statement, we are not seeking the full eight years credit, only that this type of work be considered as fulfilling a portion of that requirement.

A. Report of the Rules Committee - Jimmie Nunn, Chairman

Mr. Nunn reported that the Rules Committee has been meeting every Wednesday morning and the rules are now approximately 80% completed. Emergency land surveyor rules should be completed prior to the September meeting and ready for adoption at that time.

B. Report of the Special Committee on Engineering/Land Surveying - Mr. Palmer, Chairman.

It was moved by Mr. Gookin and seconded by Mr. Durand that the last two paragraphs of the report of the committee (p of these minutes) be submitted to the different associations for feedback. MOTION CARRIED.

C. Report of the Special Committee on Land Surveying Examination - Mr. Durand, Chairman. Mr. Durand reported on the decisions reached at the committee meeting in Casa Grande on July 30, 1982. It was moved by Mr. Durand and seconded by Mr. Gookin that the Board adopt the Fundamentals of Land Surveying, (NCEE), as the Land Surveying In-Training exam. MOTION CARRIED.

It was moved by Mr. Durand and seconded by Mr. Gookin that the Principles and Practices of Land Surveying, (NCEE) be adopted as the morning part of the professional examination. MOTION CARRIED.

It was moved by Mr. Durand and seconded by Mr. Gookin that the Board give a local examination on Arizona Legal Principles as the afternoon portion of the professional examination. MOTION CARRIED.

It was moved by Mr. Durand and seconded by Mr. Gookin that an interim set of questions for the local examination be prepared and that the questions be similar, through not identical, to those in Sections 2 and 4 of the 1980 local land surveying exam. MOTION CARRIED.

It was moved by Mr. Durand and seconded by Mr. Gookin that the Chairman of the Board appoint a committee of land surveyors to write the local exam for April and thereafter and that the Board review the exam prior to the administration. Mr. Durand requested that the records show that he returned the old local examination. Chairman O'Bannon suggested that the interim exam be prepared by either Phill Borgo at ASU or Phil Newman of U of A, if either would be willing.

Mr. Nunn suggested amending the motion to provide both land surveyors and educators draft the examination. Amendment accepted. MOTION CARRIED.

Mr. Culp expressed his opinion of the National Examination and requested

to take the local examination on Arizona law and principles. Mr. Culp stated that the Board should have the examination earlier than October 28 and 29.

Mr. Nunn noted that the exam had to be rewritten and that it would be virtually impossible to give the exam earlier than the October date. It was moved by Mr. Nunn and seconded by Mr. Gookin that land surveyor applicants who applied prior to April 16 be notified that they may at their discretion, request examination in October (but not earlier). Mr. Palmer asked that the motion be admended to read "in October or April" since some applicants might not be prepared for the October exams. Ms. Finley asked that the motion be further amended to provide for no refunds of examination fees. Both amendments were accepted. MOTION CARRIED, 7-1, on a roll call vote, with Chairman O'Bannon voting "no."

To Whom It May Concern:

This letter is being written as a formal protest of the action that the Evaluation Committee has taken toward my application for registration to practice.

When originally sent on March 15, 1982, the application specified "Structural/Civil" as the branch of registration requested. Several weeks later the entire application was returned to me accompanied by a note stating that I must specify either structural or civil or fill out separate applications for each branch. Unaware that an exam would be required for the structural option due to the lack of information on the instruction sheet, and structural engineering being my current field of employment, I subsequently requested the structural branch.

After the May, 1982 meeting of the Evaluation Committee I received a letter dated May 27, 1982 advising me that the Committee had recommended that I be held for the October, 1982 written examinations, parts 5 and 6, at a cost of \$15.00 each. Upon receipt of this letter I called Ms. Judi E. Ross, Executive Director of the Board to clarify the reason for the exam requirement. It was then stated that the Committee apparently felt that I lacked sufficient experience in the structural field and therefore recommended that I take the exams. My response to this was that as stated in my application, I was already a registered professional engineer in Wisconsin (obtained through examination) and was applying for registration in Arizona via reciprocity. I was then informed that I could obtain only a "civil" registration via reciprocity. I then asked that the branch on my application be changed to civil, to which I was told that the request would have to be made in writing. A written request was sent to the Board on June 1, 1982.

several weeks passed. When I again contacted the Board concerning the status of my application, I was informed that the Evaluation Committee was to meet the following day to review my application for a STRUCTURAL engineer's registration. I then explained to the Board's representative that I had sent a written request to change the branch to civil. After being placed on hold for several minutes, I was informed that the letter had been misplaced but was found and would be submitted to the Committee as a special request by Ms. Ross.

On Monday, July 19, 1982 I again called the Board to inquire into the status of my application. I was told that the Evaluation Committee had requested that I resubmit my application in full with the \$75.00 application fee. At this point I voiced my protest regarding having not been informed of this earlier in the application process. I feel that the Board's request is grossly unjust due to the lack of explanation regarding reciprocity in the instructions to the application.

In closing, the time lapse that has taken place since my application was originally presented to the Board has cost my company in excess of \$500.00 in consulting fees for work that we do in the State of Arizona. I therefore ask that the Board of Technical Registration reconsider their request for resubmittal of my application for registration as a professional civil engineer. Your prompt attention to this matter would be greatly appreciated.

X. REPORT OF THE LEGISLATIVE COMMITTEE - Dick Palmer, Chairman

- A. Mr. Palmer discussed the work that the Legislative Committee has been doing in relation to the Engineering and Land Surveying question. He informed the Board that the committee will meet again and re-word the draft and submit the report to the Board at its next meeting.
- B. NCARB EXAMINATION

Mr. Riggs discussed the NCARB examinations and how NCARB is changing its examination. He stated that the Board might like to look into eventually removing the AIT requirement from the law since NCARB will no longer be giving an in-training examination as such, although he felt that the Board should not take such action during the 1983 legislature.

- C. OTHER LEGISLATIVE PROPOSALS Mr. Durand proposed that the legislative committee draft legislation providing that all land surveyor applicants, including commity applicants, be required to take part 3 of the examination (Legal Principles of Land Surveying).
- XI. REPORT OF THE BUDGET COMMITTEE Mr. Brown, Chairman

Mr. Brown requested that Ms. Ross review the budget with the Board. Ms. Ross discussed the fiscal impact of the new architectural exam on the 1982-83 budget and noted that it only increased the anticipated short-fall; she further stated that, if current projections proved valid, it would be extremely difficult, if not impossible to meet operating requirements without a supplemental appropriation. Ms. Ross then presented the 1983-84 Budget Request to the Board for its consideration. It was moved by Mr. Nunn and seconded by Mr. Brown that the 1983-84 Budget Request be approved as presented. Motion carried.

REPORT OF THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

A. Enforcement Status Report - Mr. Dalrymple, Investigations Supervisor, reported on enforcement activities, noting that considerable progress had been made in resolving pending cases, with 65 active cases on record as of August 31, 1982.

- B. Registration Status Report Ms. Ross reported that as of June 30, 1982, the Board had 10,680 active professional registrants, having granted 638 new professional registrations during FY 1981-82.
- C. Staff Responsibilities Ms. Ross discussed the problem of understaffing, particularly in the clerical field, and requested the Board's cooperation.
- D. Council of State Governments Ms. Ross attended the conference and reported that it was quite beneficial. She noted that she had gained some valuable insight into the operations of other regulatory agencies, especially in the area of enforcement.

VIII. UNFINISHED BUSINESS

Report of the Special Committee on Land Surveyor Examinations - Mr. Durand stated "that after due consideration on what he was going to bring to the Board's attention, he would like to defer the discussion."

Ms. Ross discussed the letters the Board had received from Herbert Culp and from Richard Mybeck, attorney for Elmer Culp. She stated she had talked with Mr. Mybeck, and he wanted to know if there was anyway that the Board could expedite grading of Part III of the land surveyors' examination, and if the Board could request Mountain Bell to hold printing of affected yellow pages. Ms. Ross stated that she felt we should make an effort to have the exams graded as soon as possible so that registrants could be granted registration. Dear Mr. Smith:

On October 13th and 14th, 1981, my brother, Elmer L. Culp, my nephew, Homer O. Culp, and myself applied for our licenses for Land Surveyor in the State of Arizona. We submitted the required forms, information and fees to the State of Arizona Technical Board of Registration (Board) for Architects. Assayers, Engineers, Geologists, Landscape Architects, and Land Surveyors. In the usual flow of processing, these applications would have been reviewed, we would have been notified if additional information was needed. If so, we would have supplied it and then the applications would have gone before an evaluation committee (Made up of Board members). By December of 1981 or January of 1982 we would have been informed of one of the following:

- 1. We had met requirements and no test would be required.
- 2. We would be required to pass a test to meet requirements.
- 3. Our request had been denied for lack of experience or education.

In the State of Arizona a combination of six (6) years education and/or experience is required (Article 2 Section 32-122 B ARS).

At this time, however, the Arizona State Attorney General's Office (AG) handed down an opinion that under the Arizona Revised Statutes (ARS) as amended April 28, 1980 (Exhibit "A") the Board had the right to test only those applicants that it felt had insufficient education and/or experience. (It has never been explained to me why the Attorney General gave this opinion.) In adherance to this opinion the Board issued 61 Land Surveyor licenses to non-tested applicants on November 5, 1981. The Arizona Society of Professional Land Surveyors (APLS) filed a court action immediately, contesting the AG's opinion. It also requested a court order, refraining the Board from issuing any more licenses until the case was decided. This order was never signed.

In late December, Elmer went to the Board to check on the progress of our applications, and was told that the Board was under a court order not to issue any licenses to surveyors. He and I went to the court and found out the truth. We returned to the Board and we were then told that it was a mutual, oral

agreement between the Board and the APLS (there is no proof this agreement does or ever did exist). We pointed out to the Board that we felt this agreement was illegal and that we, pursuant to ARS April 28, 1980, wanted our applications processed without delay. We also then, and many times since, have pointed out to the Board that the only question before the court is whether or not an applicant can be tested. We have even asked to be given the test so as to get our licenses.

On March 16, 1982, the court decided in favor of the AG's opinion and ordered the Board to licnese applicants. Because of the attitude of the Board, I requested the Governor to intervene on our behalf (Exhibit "B"). The Board did nothing. On March 31, 1982, I received a reply from the Governor (Exhibit "C") stating the Board was going to act. On April 9, 1982, I had an attorney write the Board on our behalf (Exhibit "D").

Sometime in late March the APLS appealed the court decision. On April 16, 1982, the Governor signed into immediate effect a bill amending the ARS of April 28, 1980 (Exhibit "E"). This bill definately states that Surveyor applicants have to be tested. If the APLS felt the old bill said Surveyors had to be tested, why lobby and sponsor a new bill to do the same thing?

On April 21, 1982, the court allowed the APLS to change it's plea on the appeal. This change amounted to the court deciding if applicants pending could be made to take the test perscribed in the new law. There is no retroactive clause in this bill and no Grandfather clause. As the APLS-sponsored this bill, why didn't they put a retroactive clause in it? Or, if they did, why was it removed prior to passage? I do not believe the court to have the right to make this bill retroactive. That would take, as it did with the test, legislation by the State of Arizona. I further believe, that such legislation would have to engulf all those practicing Land Surveying in Arizona prior to April 16, 1982, that had not previously taken a test, not just those unfortunate enough to be applicants at this time. Also, if this plea was to decide the fate of the applicants, I believe that legally, the applicants should have been given written notice and time to prepare council of it's own to defend their rights in this case.

In the first suit applicants were denied legal representation on grounds that they did not have "vested rights". In the second case of late April 1982, I feel that since applicants were on record, that they did have "vested rights" and should have been allowed legal representation. My brother and I told this to the Board and the AG's Office.

I would like to point out that had the Board fulfilled it's obligation as a public servant of the people of Arizona, that the $60 \pm \text{applicants}$ on file on November 5, 1981 would have already been acted upon. The fact that the Board did not act, I believe, is a violation of these applicants constitutional rights and their state rights.

In May I retained another attorney (John Giles of Scottsdale, Arizona) to investigate this matter and advise and represent myself and Elmer and Homer in the coming hearing. In this capacity he contacted Mr. Sheets of the AG's Office and was advised not to be present as council for applicants, as the AG's Office was going to request dismissal on the gournds that the applicants were denied council. Three applicants having council would not have changed the fact that the now 100± others did not, but, might cloud the issue.

On May 19, 1982, the Board sent applicants notice (Exhibit "F") that on May 20, 1982 a hearing was being held that might have an affect on their pending licenses. I believe this letter was an attempt on the part of the Board to cover themselves with paper in case someone decided he had not recieved notice. However, this does not constitute proper, formal notice, nor does it spell out their rights.

In June the court handed down the decision that the Board had acted right in licensing the 61 applicants on November 5, 1981, but the 100± applicants now pending would have to be licensed under the new law. I believe this decision on the applicants to be:

- · 1. Illegal because
 - a. the court does not have the right to pass laws, and
 - b. the applicants were denied council.
 - It is discriminatory that these applicants be required to take a test while others (Civil Engineers, those the Board said did not have to be tested) who applied under the same laws (ARS as amended April 16, 1982) are allowed to practice the art of Land Surveying.

The 1980 law and the 1982 law require that those practicing Land Surveying to be licensed. By allowing Engineers to practive Land Surveying, I believe the law to be discriminating to the Land Surveyor.

I was advised by Mr. Giles that as both parties, APLS and AG's Office would appeal the decision that my best course of action would be to wait for a final act by the court, and at that time I could, if I wished, sue. That a suit before the decision was unadvisable. Because of the financial plight of my brother and myself, I had Mr. Giles write the Board requesting we be given the test immediately (Exhibit "G"). As before, it was ignored.

On August 13, 1982, by brother attended a Board meeting and asked that as he had passed the National Surveyor's examination in Indiana, that he be allowed to take the four hour Arizona section of the test now, so as to obtain his license. The Board voted 8 to 1 against this request. On August 19, 1982, the Board sent a letter to all applicants (Exhibit "H") implying that if they did not reapply under the new law they would not be given a test or Surveyor's license for at least another year. I believe this to be another act by the Board to deprive these applicants of their constitutional and state rights.

I believe that a citizen of the United States applying for anything (welfare check, to take entrance exams for college, marriage license or licenses required to pursue livelihood, etc.) that if they use the proper proceedures and pass the legal state requirements for same, in force at the time of thier applications, they have a constitutional right to what they are applying for. I believe that to require more from them, or pass new laws, or change requirements after application, is in direct violation of their constitutional rights and discriminatory toward them.

I also feel that the second case filed by the APLS after the new law gave them what they wanted is a form of harassment.

I believe the actions of the Board has:

 Deprived the applicants their rights to make a living in their chosen profession.

2. Given a monopoly to the APLS.

Caused considerable financial loss and mental anguish to the applicants and their families.

I have raised five (5) questions in this letter:

1. Have we been deprived of our civil rights?

- Is the law discriminating against the Surveyor, as vs. the Engineer?
- 3. Is the action by the APLS a form of harassment to the applicants of record prior to April 16, 1982, and the 61 who were licensed on November 5, 1981?
- 4. Is this a form of curtailing competition in the professions, thus, creating, in effect, a monopoly?
- 5. Does a court of law have the authority to add to, or take away from, a law that has been passed by legislation?

I believe the answers to these questions can only be achieved through a federal investigation into the activities of the Board and the APLS. I am therefore, formally requesting a federal investigation. If this is not the proper office for this letter I would appreciate you forwarding it on. If you can not, please notify me as to the proper proceedures and I will see that it is forwarded along the proper channels.

Thank you for your time and all the help you can give to this very important matter.



Gentlemen:

The purpose of this letter is to set forth the professional experience of Don T. Shannon, a recent applicant for registration as a land surveyor in the State of Arizona. I have known Mr. Shannon for almost ten years, he is not related to me by blood or marriage, and my acquaintance with him has been such that I am familiar with his proficiency in land surveying.

In order that you may evaluate my qualifications for judging Mr. Shannon's experience, I will outline my background. From April 1, 1973 through April 30, 1979, I held the position of Assistant Division Engineer for Southern Pacific, headquartered at Tucson. Since May 1, 1979, I have been Area Engineer at the same location.

In both positions, I have been in responsible charge of all construction, design, engineering, and surveying work performed by or for Southern Pacific in the States of Arizona and New Mexico and in El Paso County in Texas. I am a Registered Professional Engineer (Civil) and a Registered Land Surveyor in Arizona.

I have a degree of Bachelor of Science in Engineering from Texas Western College (now the University of Texas at El Paso).

Mr. Shannon has been continuously employed in our Engineering Department throughout the time I have been at Tucson, and for a few years before. His various position titles have been Junior Instrumentman, Instrumentman, Junior Engineer, and Assistant Engineer. The nature of his assignments has involved general construction and surveying work, much of the time as party chief, some drafting, and engineering calculations.

The surveying experience has included boundary, construction, and location surveys. During the 114 months of the period from April, 1973 through September, 1982, it is my considered

opinion that 72 months should be categorized as being professional work, with the remaining 42 being sub-professional. Of the 72 professional months, Shannon could be considered as being in responsible charge for 48 months.

For the past several years, Southern Pacific has been in the process of disposing of surplus land which was acquired at one time for railroad operating purposes, but is not currently being so used. Much of this property was in Arizona, and a substantial portion of it was in Tucson. It is property acquired by purchase as confirmed by a deed, rather than right-of-way acquired by Act of Congress or conveyed by easement or franchise from some public body.

Many of the deeds, and consequently the land survey descriptions, date from the year 1879. Sale of such lands often involves actual retracing of old property boundaries, very definitely an aspect of land surveying, and Mr. Shannon has performed such work at a professional level, receiving only general direction from myself or a Registered Land Surveyor in my office.

During 1978 and 1979, we conducted a survey in southern New Mexico, near El Paso, Texas, for a potential new main line. This survey was approximately 42 miles in length, and traversed an area which ranged from rural to isolated and unpopulated, with one stretch of quite rugged terrain. In addition to establishing control points and conducting a sophisticated location survey for railroad civil engineering purposes, all control points and certain other centerline stations were tied to section corners and/or quarter corners.

The ties to public land surveys were performed so that property could be acquired and right-of-way maps filed, if or when such action seems desirable. On occasion, Mr. Shannon was assigned to work with the party chief conducting this survey, particularly when finding corners was involved.

This work was certainly in accordance with the principles of land surveying, and again Mr. Shannon's participation was at a professional level.

Prior to the time I came to Tucson, Shannon was employed in the Engineering Department from March, 1969 through March, 1973, a period of 49 months. Much of this time he occupied a minor position, and many of the surveys on which he was employed were of a construction nature, rather than involving location or boundaries. Nonetheless, some of the above time should be considered professional. Although I have no first hand knowledge of Mr. Shannon's performance during that period, my own background enables me to make a reasonable estimate, and I would assign 15 months as professional work, with the remaining 34 being sub-professional, and 10 of the 15 months considered as being in responsible charge.

In addition, the applicant attended the University of Arizona and was enrolled in courses which would lead to a degree in Civil Engineering. According to your Code, this should count as another 12 months in professional work.

To summarize, it would appear that Don Shannon has the equivalent of 99 months in professional work, and that this in turn should entitle him to take the written examinations, and that the results of such examinations should determine whether or not he is at this time qualified for registration.

It is my hope that this letter will be of some benefit in enabling the Board to more completely analyze Mr. Shannon's professional experience.

Because of the confidential nature of some of the surveys mentioned above as having been performed by my Company, it will be appreciated if this information is used only to evaluate Mr. Shannon, and does not become general public knowledge.

Dear Mr. Jernigan:

On behalf of the State Board of Technical Registration, I would like to request your assistance in preparing the following legislative proposals for introduction (as a single bill) during the 1983 legislative session. I would appreciate any suggestions or changes you may wish to make to ensure that the draft is technically and legally sound.

1. SEE ATTACHMENT I. The intent of these amendments is to revise the definition of "land surveying practice" and to require engineers wishing to perform certain aspects of that practice to secure registration as land surveyors. Further, a grandfather clause is proposed which would permit any engineer registered prior to the effective date of the Act to acquire land surveyor registration without meeting any additional qualification requirements, provided application is made on or before July 1, 1984.

This language was drafted by a legislative committee of the Board, and we would appreciate your attention to several items. (1) Are the amendments properly located? (2) Is it clear that an engineer registered prior to the effective date of the Act may secure registration as a land surveyor by simply making application (without meeting any other qualifications) on or before July 1, 1984? (3) Is additional language or revision necessary to allow an engineer to continue to practice land surveying during the interim between the effective date of the Act and July 1, 1984?

11. SEE ATTACHMENT II. The intent of these amendments is to require all applicants, including out-of-state registrants, to take and pass, prior to registration, the local portion of the professional examination. Again, we would appreciate your thorough review to assure that the language and location satisfies the intent.

Should you need additional information or clarification, please let me know. Thank you for your cooperation and assistance.
